PROGRAMME OVERVIEW

Conference on Linguistic and Intercultural Education – *CLIE-2024*:

Alba Iulia, 28 - 30 June 2024

Conference aims and scope:

Affiliated with 1 Decembrie 1918 University of Alba Iulia, Romania, situated in Central Europe, at the crossroads between Romance, Slavic, German and Hungarian cultures and languages, the CIEL Centre has been long activating in the field of language education, intercultural awareness-raising and active citizenship promotion. Its members, academics, practitioners and researchers alike, understand linguistic and intercultural education as paramount to constructing a global citizenship of culturally competent and aware individuals who display cultural insights and a sense of belonging to the humanity at large.

Artificial Intelligence (AI) has had a booming entrance into our daily landscape, affecting most areas of people's lives, both in a positive and negative manner. Language, as the most basic tool for communication, is being inevitably reshaped as AI resets the ways in which information is perceived and conveyed, also challenging language users and analysts at the level of creativity and motivation. On the one hand, AI can automate repetitive and mundane tasks and save time for users, but on the other, it can also impact the level of human creativity. Over-reliance on AI for more innovative tasks may lead to a decline in human creativity and innovation. If individuals become accustomed to AI-generated ideas or solutions, they may rely less on their own creative instincts and problem-solving skills, resulting in a stagnation of human creativity over time.

Likewise, problematic issues may arise in connection with emotional intelligence. AI is beginning to simulate emotions or generate emotionally expressive responses. Due to this tendency to develop the emotional intelligence of AI's applications by replicating more and more imitative reactions of humans, the improvement of AI is perceived as a possibility to enhance human-computer interactions, making AI more relatable and empathetic. While this seems very useful in some contexts, it often has drawbacks because it cannot yet provide personalized emotional support by analysing an individual's emotional state and offering appropriate interventions or suggestions in all contexts. Artificial Intelligence inevitably causes growing apprehensions about bias, ethical considerations or cultural sensitivity.

As legal frameworks and guidelines are still being developed, AI applications seem to be successfully replacing most professional activities pertaining to language and intercultural communication, we are inevitably faced with a series of legitimate concerns about the directions and evolution of this research field: to what extent are the traditional approaches to translation, interpretation, teaching, learning, and research still needed and how should these be reshaped in order to genuinely benefit daily life experience.

CLIE-2024 invites everyone interested in language studies, translation studies, language acquisition and teaching, and intercultural communication to bring their expertise and contribute to the ongoing global conversation related to the inclusion of Artificial Intelligence in this research area.
